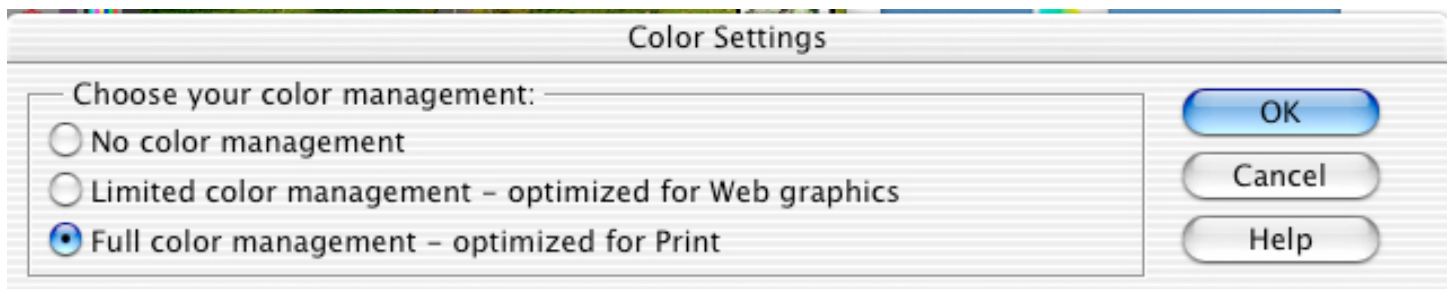
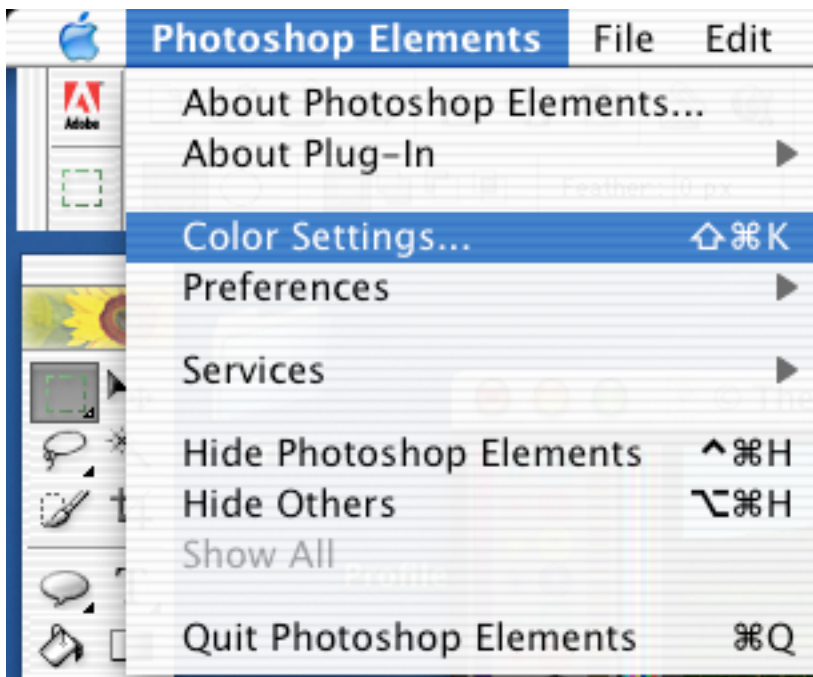


How to use a custom printer profile in Adobe Photoshop Elements.

PhotoShop Elements is an excellent program for its price.
One of the things not in Elements is the ability to assign or convert an image.

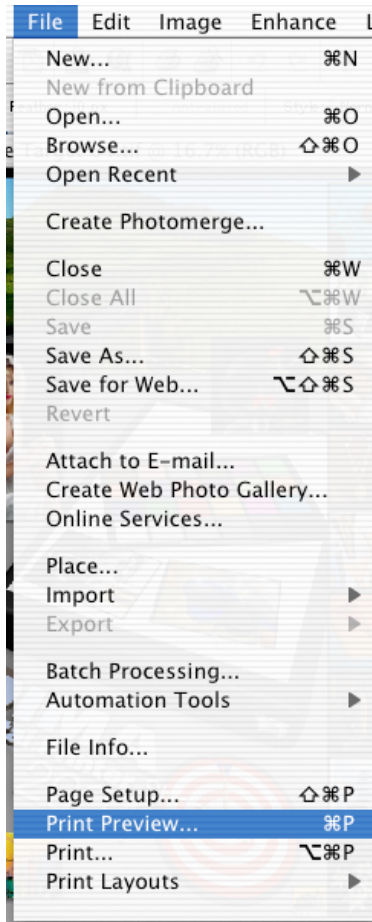
You can still use a custom printer profile within Elements by using the following information.

1. From the Edit menu select Color Settings.

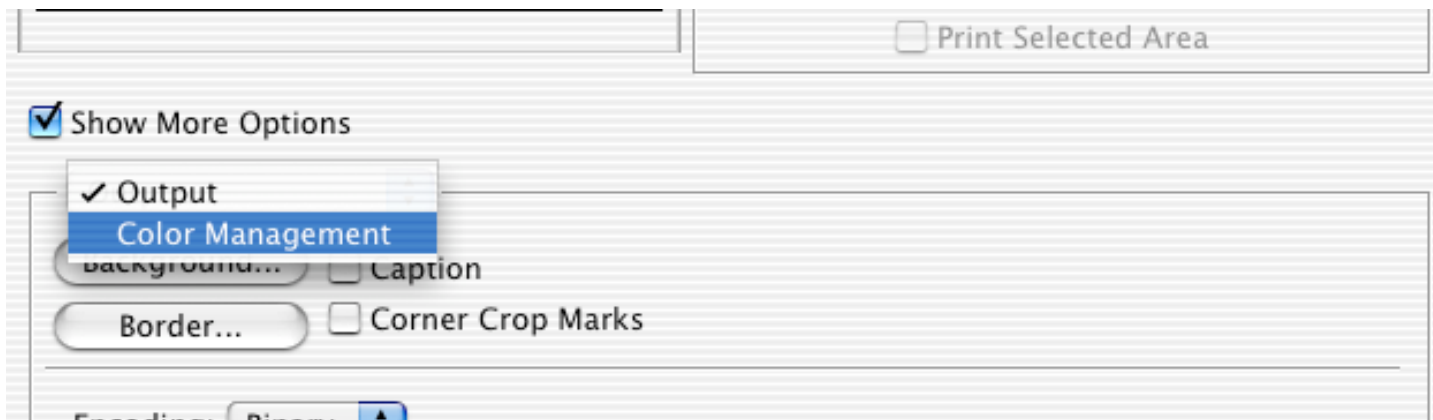


2. Select Full Color Management
3. Now open an image.

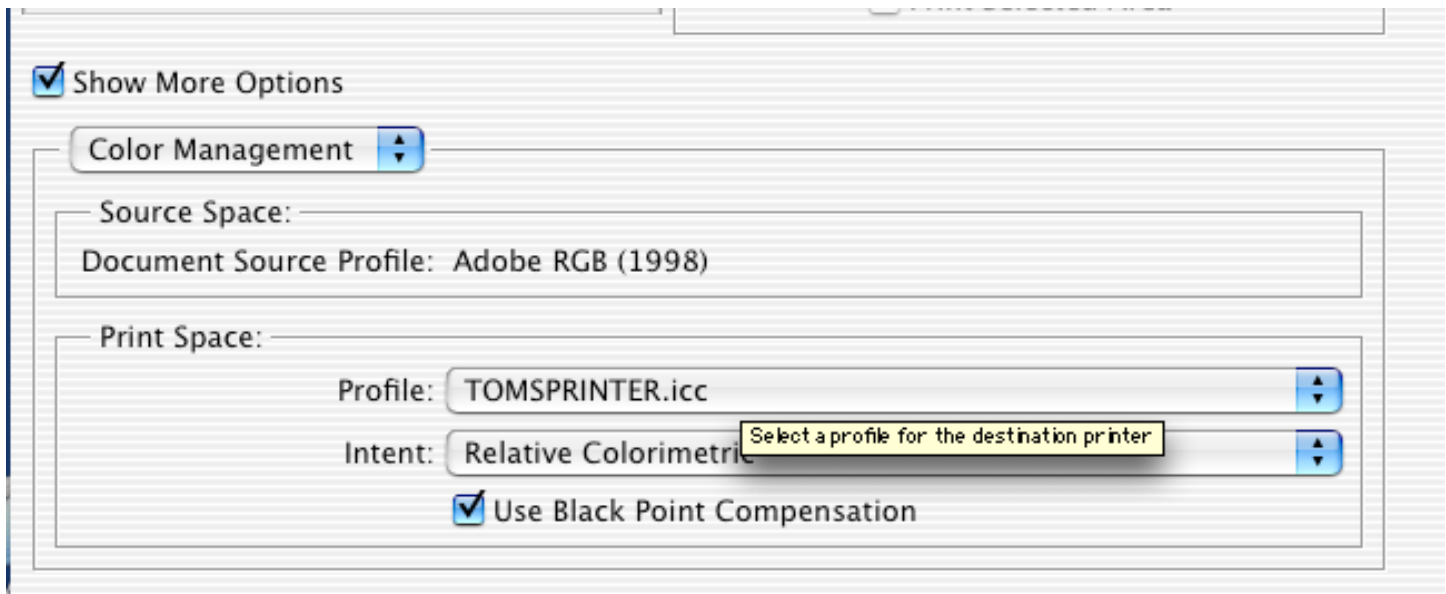
4. Go to File Print Preview (not print)



5. Click Show More Options



6. Toggle to Color Management



7. Here is where you would select your custom printer profile.
8. ColorSync will convert your document colorspace to your printer space in the background. This will happen seamlessly. No need to convert your file (not possible in Elements anyway)

A custom printer profile will give you a very close match to what you see on screen if your monitor is calibrated and profiled.

Just think if you could get really good color on your first print and not your fourth.
How much time you will save.
How much ink and paper you will save.
Friends and relatives will admire how good your prints look.

With a good custom printer profile and this information you can obtain the same high quality prints that you can with printing from Adobe Photoshop. Adobe Photoshop lists for \$ 649.00
